

# ADMISSION REGULATIONS

## General admission regulations that apply to all prospective students

- The admission requirements and general information provided in this Faculty brochure are applicable to students who apply for admission to the University of Pretoria with a National Senior Certificate (NSC) or an Independent Examination Board (IEB) qualification.
- The following persons will be considered for admission to a first bachelor's degree at the University of Pretoria:
  - Candidates who have a certificate that is deemed by the University to be equivalent to the required National Senior Certificate (NSC) with bachelor's degree endorsement;
  - Candidates who are graduates from another tertiary institution or have been granted the status of a graduate of such an institution; and
  - Candidates who are graduates of another faculty at the University of Pretoria.
- Grade 11 results are used for the conditional admission of prospective students, but final admission will depend on the NSC (or equivalent) qualification and results.
- Candidates must also comply with the specific subject and achievement level requirements and the minimum Admission Point Score (APS) for their chosen degree programmes.
- The APS calculation is done by using the NSC 1 to 7 scale of achievement. It is based on a candidate's achievement in six recognised 20-credit subjects. The highest APS that can be achieved is 42. Life Orientation is a 10-credit subject and is excluded from the calculation when determining the APS. The following subject rating scores are used for calculating the APS for NSC/IEB:

- Except in cases where modules or programmes require the use of a language other than English, all modules will be presented in English, which is the University's official language of tuition, communication and correspondence.
- Minimum requirements for admission to the relevant programmes are set out in the minimum admission requirements table in this brochure.
- Meeting the minimum admission requirements does not guarantee admission into a programme.
- Applicants with qualifications other than NSC and IEB should refer to the following publication:

- School of Tomorrow (SOT), Accelerated Christian Education (ACE) and General Education Development (GED):** These qualifications are not accepted at the University of Pretoria.
- National Certificate (Vocational) (NCV) Level 4:** The University of Pretoria may consider NCV candidates, provided they meet the exemption for bachelor's status criteria and the programme requirements.

### APPLICATION AND CLOSING DATES:

- Applications open on 1 April. All study programmes at the University of Pretoria are number-limited. You are encouraged to submit your application as soon as possible after 1 April.
- The closing date for applications for all UP study programmes is 30 June. This excludes the programmes in the Faculty of Veterinary Science which close on 31 May.

### APPLICATION STATUS:

- Apply with your final Grade 11 (or equivalent) results.
- Applicants can expect feedback by September at the latest.
- Please check your application status and communication regularly on the UP Student Portal at [www1.up.ac.za](http://www1.up.ac.za).
- Final admission will be based on the applicant's final school-year NSC or equivalent results.

# ADMISSION REGULATIONS

## Faculty-specific admission regulations

- Applicants who indicate Theology as a first or second choice will be considered, but those who indicate it as their second choice may have to submit a motivation.

## Application requirements

- The closing date for applications for programmes in this faculty is 30 June.
- Meeting the minimum admission requirements does not guarantee admission into a programme.

## University of Pretoria programme qualification verification

The higher education sector has undergone an extensive alignment to the Higher Education Qualification Sub-Framework (HEQSF) across all institutions in South Africa. In order to comply with the HEQSF, all institutions are legally required to participate in a national initiative led by regulatory bodies such as the Department of Higher Education and Training (DHET), the Council on Higher Education (CHE), and the South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA). The University of Pretoria is presently engaged in an ongoing effort to align its qualifications and programmes with the HEQSF criteria. Current and prospective students should take note that changes to UP qualification and programme names may occur as a result of the HEQSF initiative. Students are advised to contact their faculties if they have any questions.

## Why study at the Faculty of Theology and Religion?

People study Theology and Religion for various reasons, and not only to make it their profession. Some find it to be a fascinating field that they would like to explore, whereas others search for spiritual growth through study, or may want to gain insights that will help them to function more effectively in the workplace. The Faculty also offers programmes that will benefit students who do not necessarily want to become ministers, but would like to enrich their lives and faith experiences.

There are many advantages to enriching one's study in a particular field with insights from the Faculty of Theology and Religion. By including modules from this discipline in other areas of study, such as computer science, engineering, languages, psychology, social work and teaching, graduates can enter their chosen careers as better equipped and more fully developed individuals.



The Diploma in Theology is intended for candidates who have completed the NSC/IEB (or equivalent), but without the required university admission.		

## Undergraduate programmes in Theology and Religion

The five main components of the study of theology and religion focus on questions about the Bible and life.

### New Testament and Related Literature

In the New Testament, the story of Jesus is told and elaborated on from several perspectives. New Testament Studies focuses on the books of the New Testament and on the first- and second-century Mediterranean context in which they originated.

### Old Testament and Hebrew Scriptures

The Old Testament is concerned with God's relationship with Israel and His involvement with humanity and creation. Old Testament Studies explores the books of the Old Testament and the life settings of ancient Israel. These texts show how ancient Israelites engaged with issues such as suffering and love, and offer guidance for living in the presence of God in different circumstances today.

### Practical Theology and Mission Studies

Practical Theology focuses on what Christians do—how they experience and express their faith through actions. Topics studied in this field include worship as lived religion, preaching, the meaning of symbols and symbolic acts, helping people in times of crisis, teaching and forming faith and understanding the world in which we live in.

### Religion Studies

Religion Studies is a life-enriching programme open to anyone interested in religion. Students from a wide range of fields, such as engineering, architecture, music, political science, law and fine arts, choose this module to broaden their perspective. It addresses questions such as why people are religious, what ancient people believed and how we can understand and respect our neighbours from other religious denominations.

### Systematic and Historical Theology

Systematic and Historical Theology combines integrated and specialised themes. Historical reflection examines not only the history of the Christian church and the lives of significant figures—from Saint Augustine to Saint Aquinas, and from John Calvin to Martin Luther—but also explores how different Christian traditions are structured in the modern era. Systematic reflection focuses on faith (in God and as a relationship) and beliefs in relation to themes such as creation, Scripture, Christ, the Holy Spirit, salvation and the future. It also looks at the ways faith is expressed in community life and addresses ethical and societal challenges.

### What does studies in Theology and Religion entail?

Studies in Theology and Religion deal with the fundamental questions of life:

- How do faith and religion influence people's lives and society?
- How does one approach ethical and moral questions in the workplace?
- How do theological insights promote good human resource practices?
- How does one cultivate ecological sensitivity and awareness?
- How do Christians relate to laws?
- How do religious values contribute to peace and good human relations?
- Can crime be stopped by appealing to people's beliefs and values?
- What is the meaning and purpose of life?
- Where does one find answers to the most profound life questions?
- How does one gain a better understanding of humanity to make a difference in the world?
- What kind of leaders are needed to shape society and the world?

For students who feel called to work in churches as ministers, pastors, priests, lay preachers, missionaries or youth workers, studies in Theology and Religion provides a strong foundation for their vocation. Others may combine their theological studies with qualifications in fields such as social work, development work, psychology, education, journalism, engineering, law or business, adding depth to their professional practice with a deeper understanding of humanity and society.

### Postgraduate programmes in Theology and Religion

#### Bachelor of Theology Honours

The purpose of this programme is to provide graduate students with specialised knowledge, skills and competence in particular fields of theology at the postgraduate level.

#### Master of Divinity – MDiv

A coursework Master's degree programme in general theology covers all five theological disciplines and focuses on advanced theological knowledge and practical skills.

#### Master of Theology – MTh

This programme offers students with an appropriate four year theological qualification an opportunity for theological specialisation at master's level. Students can choose between a programme with coursework and a mini-dissertation or a research-based master's degree that requires the completion of a dissertation. The coursework modules offer students an opportunity to acquire specialised skills in a particular discipline.

#### Doctor of Philosophy – PhD

A theological undergraduate degree, followed by a Master of Theology (MTh) or an equivalent degree, allows a student to pursue a PhD. This degree is awarded in recognition of highly specialised knowledge and expertise gained through original research.

### Centre for Faith and Community

The Centre for Faith and Community, hosted by the Faculty of Theology and Religion at the University of Pretoria, focuses on training community and church leaders in South Africa and beyond, equipping them to engage effectively in their respective contexts. In addition to its research and consulting services, the Centre's core mission is to empower change-makers to immerse themselves in local communities, understand their contexts, reflect theologically and biblically, and develop ministry responses that foster healing and transformation.

Our training is designed to prepare leaders to address the challenges faced by their communities and to guide them in tackling the deeper causes of these challenges. It helps communities envision new and preferred realities, make the most of their own resources and strengths, and implement locally owned ministry practices, processes and programmes that promote lasting change. The target audience includes spiritual leaders, non-profit leaders, business leaders, public servants, parents, caregivers and others seeking to be equipped for more effective community and ministry engagement.

- Table 1 primarily applies to UP candidates with Umalusi school leaving certificates (NSC, IEB and SACAI).
- FLY@UP Assist First-Year Awards are based on the final school-year examination results as issued by Umalusi via the Department of Basic Education.
- These awards are made automatically to first-time entering first-year registered undergraduate students who meet the award criteria. Students do not apply for these awards.
- First-time entering first-year students who register for studies at UP directly after Grade 12 (final school year) or who took a gap year(s) after their final school year and who meet the award criteria will be considered.
- Students who have previously registered at a tertiary educational institution before registration at UP will not be considered for FLY@UP Assist First-Year awards. Students who registered at UP in previous years, are also not considered.
- For candidates who present an NSC/IEB Certificate, the percentages obtained for the six (6) best subjects taken, excluding Life Orientation are used. Certain subjects are EXCLUDED in the calculation of average percentages:
  - Life Orientation
  - Practical Music Grade 4 and 5 (Note: Practical Music Grades 6, 7 and 8 are considered for inclusion in the calculation of the average percentage—if your music report for this subject is not part of your NSC report, please submit your official music report to the Student Service Centre at [ssc@up.ac.za](mailto:ssc@up.ac.za), before commencement of classes.)
- Mathematical Literacy, Technical Mathematics, Technical Sciences and equivalent subjects are not eligible for this award.
- \*A candidate only qualifies for Award B if the candidate meets the criteria for Award A. Therefore, candidates who obtained 80% and above for the subjects in Award B only, will not be eligible for the subject awards.
- The calculation of the average percentage is based on the University of Pretoria's formula, per examination authority and not on the number of distinctions achieved.
- The average percentage is not rounded off.
- Results obtained for papers that have been re-marked are not considered for award purposes.
- This award will be cancelled for students who discontinue, are excluded or who terminate their studies for whatever reason during the year in which the award is made. No payouts of the award will be allowed.

- The awards in Table 2 are made automatically to first-time entering first-year registered undergraduate students who meet the award criteria. Students do not apply for these awards.
- R5 000 is awarded per symbol and only once per subject achieved, eg if you achieved an A\*, an A or a B-symbol on A-Level in Mathematics as well as an A-symbol on AS-Level in Mathematics, you will only be awarded R5 000 for Mathematics.
- First-time entering first-year students who register for studies at UP directly after Grade 12 (final school year) or who took a gap year(s) after their final school-year and who meet the award criteria will be considered.
- Students who have previously registered at a tertiary educational institution before registration at UP will not be considered for FLY@UP Assist First-Year awards. Students who registered at UP in previous years, are also not considered.
- Results obtained for papers that have been re-marked are not considered for award purposes.
- This award will be cancelled for students who discontinue, are excluded or who terminate their studies for whatever reason during the year in which the award is made. No payouts of the award will be allowed.
- Any international school-leaving qualification that can be converted to the UP bursary formula, based on the UP conversion approved guidelines, may be eligible for an award of up to R30 000.
- The University's decision is final.
- These awards are subject to the availability of funds.


