ADMISSION RULES FOR POSTGRADUATE CERTIFICATES, POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMAS AND HONOURS DEGREE STUDIES

G30

- 30.1 In addition to the rules in this Section, those contained under Section A (General Rules) and Section C (Rules for Postgraduate Study) also apply.
- 30.2 Admission criteria:
- 30.2.1 A relevant undergraduate qualification or equivalent.
 - 30.2.2 At least 60% obtained as an average final mark in the appropriate major.
Or
 - 30.2.3 By special recommendation of the Faculty concerned.

ADMISSION RULES FOR MASTERS' DEGREE STUDY

G36

- 36.1 In addition to the rules in this Section, those contained under Section A (General Rules) and Section C (Rules for Postgraduate Study) also apply.
- 36.2 Admission criteria:
- 36.2.1 A relevant honours bachelor's degree or equivalent.
 - 36.2.2 At least 60% obtained as an average final mark in the appropriate major learning programme.
Or
 - 36.2.3 By special recommendation of the Faculty concerned.
- 36.3 On the recommendation of the Faculty concerned, Senate may allow a student to do a masters degree in a programme or Faculty different from that in which he/she holds an honours degree.

ADMISSION RULES FOR DOCTORAL DEGREE STUDY

G53

- 53.1 In addition to the rules in this Section, those contained under Section A (General Rules) and Section C (Rules for Postgraduate Study) also apply.
- 53.2 Admission criteria:
- 5.3.2.1 A master's degree or equivalent qualification.
 - 53.2.2 If a candidate does not have a master's degree, he/she may be admitted to the doctoral study provided that Senate through the recognition of prior learning (RPL) is satisfied that such a candidate has reached the standard of a master's degree.
- 53.3 Before a candidate is accepted for doctoral study, the Faculty concerned must be convinced that the candidate has sufficient knowledge of the field of study to be able to fulfil the requirements for the degree.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Student Selection

Meeting the admission requirements of a programme does not guarantee admission. Postgraduate applications are subject to selection based on the number of spaces available for a programme. Academic history provides the basis of selection at the Postgraduate Diploma and Honours levels. For senior postgraduate programmes, selection is based on the supervisor capacity and the availability of other appropriate resources. Additionally, the skills profile of potential students will be assessed, and they may be required to complete additional modules or acquire competencies deemed essential by the Department.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)

The University allows for access, advanced standing and awarding of credits (for taught courses) through RPL as per the RPL policy and General Academic Rules of the University. This applies to all programmes, except those for which the Professional Body does not permit (please inquire with the relevant School). RPL will be conducted and assessed in accordance with the University General Academic Rules and the University of Limpopo Recognition of Prior Learning Policy. Applicants for postgraduate studies via the RPL route must consult with the Faculty in which they intend to study.

Financial Aid

Financial aid opportunities are available for postgraduate students. The Faculty will be able to advise you on potential funding opportunities. Potential students are also advised to contact the Financial Aid office at the University.

Expectations for the Successful Graduation of the Work

To ensure all learning outcomes are achieved, Honours and Postgraduate Diploma/Certificate students are expected to spend a minimum of 40 hours per week on their studies throughout the academic year. For Master's and Doctoral Postgraduate programme students, a minimum of 40 hours per week is required for 45 weeks of the year for full-time study.

All Master's and Doctoral students are required to have a signed Memorandum of Understanding with their supervisors outlining the expectations of both parties for the successful completion of their qualification. This includes the requirement for the approval of the research proposal within 6 months following registration.

Postgraduate Diploma in Health Promotion (PGDip (Health Promotion))

The course in Health Promotion and Education for Health aims to develop the skills of health, social work, agriculture, education, and related workers at district, regional, provincial, and national levels, as well as those who will be responsible for planning, implementing, and evaluating health promotion Programmes. The course will enable participants to acquire a broad understanding of the many facets which impact on promoting health and wellbeing, and to develop skills necessary for improving communication between service providers and communities, identifying needs, priorities, design appropriate educational materials, advocate and negotiate policies to strengthen community action, and implement empowering educational processes.

Course Design:

- (a) The Postgraduate Diploma in Health Promotion is an action-learning based full-time one-year course with six residential teaching modules for the full-time programme.
- (b) Self-study segments, supported by custom-developed teaching materials, form part of both curricula.
- (c) Each residential teaching block will last for six days (Monday to Saturday).
- (d) Students must undertake a project based in their work setting/agencies working in their area of interest.

Admission Criteria:

- (a) Applicants must be in possession of a Bachelor's degree or equivalent in Health or related disciplines.
- (b) Priority will be given to those who have or will have:
 - The responsibility for planning, implementing and evaluating health promotion activities at the district, regional and provincial levels.
 - The responsibility for the promotion of health and well-being in direct liaison with the community.

Duration

- (a) One year minimum
- (b) Two years maximum

Master of Nursing (MNurs)

The Master's degree programme is offered as a research Master's programme culminating in a dissertation relevant to the discipline.

Admission Requirements:

- (a) Applicants must be in possession of a 4 year basic degree in Nursing (Bachelor of Nursing) or post basic BNurs degree with an Honours degree in nursing (or equivalent).
- (b) Registration with South African Nursing Council as registered Nurse Practitioner.
- (c) An average of 60% in the major subjects.

Duration:

- (a) One year minimum
- (b) Three years maximum

Presentation of the Programme:

- (a) Students will be required to complete the one week research programme before taking on the research projects.
- (b) All research proposals will be registered with the University of Limpopo after approval by the relevant University Committee.

Master of Science in Dietetics (MSc (Dietetics))

The Master's degree programme is offered as a research Master's programme culminating in a dissertation relevant to the discipline.

The student is required to produce a dissertation on a subject approved by the Head of the Department. An oral examination may be required.

Admission Requirements:

- (a) A relevant 4-year Bachelor's degree or equivalent.
- (b) An average of 60% in the major subjects

Curriculum:

- (a) A dissertation must be submitted based on a topic approved by the Programme Manager and Senate.

Duration:

- (a) One year minimum
- (b) Three years maximum

Master of Optometry (MOptom)

The Master's degree programme is offered as a research Master's programme culminating in a dissertation relevant to the discipline.

Admission Requirements:

- (a) Candidates for the MOptom degree must possess a 4-year Bachelor of Optometry (BOptom) degree or its equivalent from a recognised institution.
- (b) The candidates may be required to have received at least a 60% pass in the BOptom degree in the subject for the Master's dissertation.

Duration:

- (a) One year minimum
- (b) Three years maximum

Dissertation:

- (a) A research dissertation shall be submitted for assessment.

Master of Pharmacy (MPharm)

The Master's degree programme is offered as a research Masters programme culminating in a dissertation relevant to the discipline of choice.

Discipline:

- (a) Pharmacology
- (b) Pharmaceutics

Admission Requirements:

- (a) A 4-year Bachelor's degree or equivalent in Pharmacy.
- (b) An average of 60% in the major subjects

Duration:

- (a) One year minimum
- (b) Three years maximum

Dissertation:

- (a) The assessment consists of a dissertation in addition to which an oral or written assessment may be required, on a subject approved by the Programme Manager of the relevant discipline.

Doctor of Philosophy (PhD)

The Doctoral degree programme is based on an original research project culminating in a thesis relevant to the discipline of choice.

Disciplines:

- (a) Nursing

Admission requirements:

- (a) Applicants must be in possession of a relevant Master's degree.

Duration:

- (a) Two years minimum
- (b) Four years maximum

Thesis:

- (a) A thesis shall be submitted for assessment.

Doctor of Optometry (DOptom)

The Doctoral degree programme is based on an original research project culminating in a thesis relevant to the discipline.

Admission requirements:

- (a) Applicants must be in possession of a relevant Master's degree in an Optometry Discipline

Duration:

- (a) Two years minimum
- (b) Four years maximum

Thesis:

- (a) A thesis shall be submitted for assessment.

Doctor of Pharmacy (DPharm)

The Doctoral degree programme is based on an original research project culminating in a thesis relevant to the discipline.

Admission requirements:

- (a) Applicants must be in possession of a relevant Master's degree in a Pharmacy Discipline.

Duration:

- (a) Two years minimum
- (b) Four years maximum

Thesis:

- (a) A thesis shall be submitted for assessment.

Master of Science in Medical Sciences (MSc (Medical Sciences))

The Master's degree programme is offered as a research Master's programme culminating in a dissertation relevant to the discipline of choice.

Disciplines:

- (a) Chemical Pathology
- (b) Haematology
- (c) Immunology
- (d) Medical Microbiology
- (e) Medical Genetics

Admission requirements:

- (a) A 4-year Bachelor's degree or equivalent in Medical Sciences or a 4-year Health Sciences related degree
- (b) An average of at least 60% in the relevant major subjects

Duration:

- (a) One year minimum
- (b) Three year's maximum

Master of Public Health (MPH)

Disciplines:

- (a) Health Measurement
- (b) Health Policy and Management
- (c) Environmental and Occupational Health
- (d) Social and Behavioural Sciences in Public Health

Admission Requirements:

- (a) A relevant Bachelor Honours degree or equivalent.
- (b) At least 60% in the relevant major subjects.
- (b) If Senate is satisfied that the candidate sufficiently qualifies to pursue the programme envisaged for the degree of Master of Public Health, any of the following may be admitted as a candidate:
 - (i) The holder of a degree of Bachelor of Arts or Sciences with Honours in Nursing, Psychology or Sociology or in a field which, in the opinion of the Senate, is relevant to Public Health.
 - (ii) A graduate of any other university who has satisfied the Senate by means of a written or oral test (or both) or by means of any other mode of assessment to be determined

from time to time by the Senate that he/she is qualified to undertake the line of study proposed or research (or both) required for the degree.

Duration:

- (a) One year minimum
- (b) Three years maximum

Mini-Dissertation:

- (a) A candidate shall submit a topic for the approval of the Senate before June of the first academic year of study.
- (b) A candidate may be permitted by the Senate to substitute a new topic for the research report before November of the first year

Duration:

- (a) The duration of the MMed degrees will be a minimum of four years.
- (b) The maximum will be six years.

Admission Requirements:

In order to be admitted to MMed degree course a candidate must:

- (a) Be in possession of MBChB or equivalent degree and be registered with the Health Professions Council of South Africa as a medical practitioner (Independent Practice).
- (b) Be appointed to a Registrar's post recognised by the HPCSA. This post must be occupied for the full duration of registration as required under the rules.
- (c) Meet any other requirements that may be enunciated in the rules for the specific degree for which registration is requested.

Duration:

- (a) The duration of the MMed degrees will be a minimum of five years
- (b) The maximum will be seven years.

Doctor of Philosophy (PhD)

The Doctoral degree programme is based on an original research project culminating in a thesis relevant to the discipline of choice.

Disciplines:

- (a) Chemical Pathology
- (b) Haematology
- (c) Immunology
- (d) Medical Microbiology
- (e) Medical Genetics
- (f) Public Health

Admission requirements:

- (a) Applicants must be in possession of a relevant Master's degree.

Duration:

- (c) Two years minimum
- (d) Four years maximum

Thesis:

- (a) A thesis shall be submitted for assessment.

The School of Education is primarily committed to rural regeneration, empowerment and development, through a lifelong learning approach to teaching and interdisciplinary research.

Postgraduate Certificate in Education in Further Education and Training Teaching (PGCE (FET Teaching))

The degree may be studied in the following disciplines:

- (a) Languages and Social Sciences:
English Studies or Sepedi (Sepedi to read as Northern Sotho/Sepedi) or Tshivenda or Xitsonga or Geography or History
- (b) Economic Management Sciences:
Accounting or Business Management or Economics.
- (c) Mathematics, Science & Technology:
Life Sciences or Mathematics or Physical Science (Chemistry/Physics) or Technology.
- (d) Languages and Life Orientation:
English Studies or Sepedi (Sepedi to read as Northern Sotho/Sepedi) or Tshivenda or Xitsonga AND Life Orientation.

Admission Requirements:

- (a) A candidate must have an approved Bachelor's degree (360 credits) or appropriate Diploma (2 School related subjects).

Duration:

- (a) One year minimum
- (b) Two years maximum

Advanced Diploma in Adult and Community Education and Training Teaching (AdvDip (Adult and Community Education and Training Teaching))

The degree may be studied in the following disciplines:

- (a) Mathematics, Science and Technology for ACET (Information Technology, Mathematical Literacy, Mathematics, Natural Sciences, Technology)
- (b) Economic and Management Sciences for ACET (Small, Medium and Micro-Enterprises, Economics and Management Sciences)
- (c) Humanities for ACET (English, Sepedi, Xitsonga, Tshivenda, Life Orientation, Human and Social Sciences, Early Childhood Development)

Admission Requirements:

- (a) An appropriate 360 credit Level 6 Diploma or National N-Diploma, or a 360 credit Level 7 Bachelor's degree, or a 480 credit Level 8 Bachelor's degree, sometimes referred to as a "Professional Bachelor's Degree".
- (b) Graduates entering into the programme should have included in their undergraduate qualifications at least two fields of learning that are appropriate for Lecturing subjects or fields in the ACET curriculum.
